

CCTTA Player Codes

As a member of the Central Coast Table Tennis Association, CCTTA, you must meet the following requirements during any activity held or sanctioned by the CCTTA and in your role as a player / participant in any activity held by or under the auspices of the CCTTA:

Player Conduct

- Be fair, considerate and respects the rights of fellow players. Refrain from any behaviour that may bring the CCTTA into disrepute.
- Do not use your involvement with the CCTTA to promote your own beliefs, behaviours or practices where these are inconsistent with those of the CCTTA.
- Care for and respect the equipment provided to you as part of your program.
- Conduct yourself in a professional manner relating to language, temper and punctuality. Refrain from any form of harassment of others.
- Abide by the rules and respect the decision of the official, making all appeals through the formal process and respecting the final decision.

Dress Rules

- Shirts must be worn at all times. No singlets are allowed.
- Shirts should be predominately the same colour. The shirt must not distract the opponent. CCTTA shirts are the preferred option for play.
- Shirts must **not** be a light colour eg white or cream. As the association uses white table tennis balls a light coloured shirt could camouflage the ball.
- No offensive pictures or wording will be allowed.
- All clothing should be loose enough to allow free movement of the player.
- Footwear must be worn at all times. I.e. no bare feet.
- A sports shoe is the minimum standard acceptable.
- Shoes must be securely fitted at all times. I.e. laces tied up.
- The committee reserves the right to adjudicate on any players' standard of clothing and footwear.

Breaching any part of this code may result in a player being withdrawn from play and a subsequent loss of game points. Breaching any part of this code may result in a player being given a verbal or written warning from the committee.

For more severe cases a player will be withdrawn from play and that player will not recommence play until the CCTTA committee has adjudicated on the incident. Involved players may be asked to appear before the committee.
